Priority 1- High quality inclusive teaching across the whole school so outcomes are at least in line with national for the expected standard and greater depth (Quality of Education) <i>‘Inclusive, high-quality education is a foundation for dynamic and equitable societies.’</i> <i>Desmond Tutu</i>	• Year 6 combined to be 60%- this was 53% • Lesson observations and learning walks show that 95% of lessons are good or better. (82%) • Each year group will build upon progress so that at the end of the academic year percentages are above their starting baseline (apart from Year 3) • There will be a minimum of 8% of children achieving greater depth standard in each year group. Only in Year 2 <u>By Summer 2027</u> • Year 6 combined target to be 65% • Lesson observations and learning walks show that 95% of lessons are good or better. • There will be a minimum of 10% of children targeted to achieve greater depth standard in each year group.
Priority 2- Oracy is an embedded part of the curriculum which leads to positive writing outcomes across the curriculum (Quality of Education- English) <i>‘Language is the main tool that promotes thinking, develops reasoning, and supports cultural activities like reading and writing.’</i> <i>Vygotsky</i>	• 80% of children will be able to confidently and articulately talk in front of their class • Voice 21 data • P4C is embedded within the curriculum and happens each half term • Writing data shows a significant improvement from baselines • Oracy is an integral part of the writing curriculum • Communication and language is supported well especially for those with special needs so that they can develop their vocabulary and use it across the curriculum. <u>By Summer 2027</u> • 90% of children will be able to confidently and articulately talk in front of a wider audience • Voice 21 data • P4C is embedded within the curriculum and happens each half term • Writing data shows a significant improvement from baselines • Oracy is an integral part of the writing curriculum • Communication and language is planned for and embedded into the EYFS curriculum to support development upon entry to the school.
